Zero Cavities - Big Smiles



According to the Department of Health, oral disease continues to be a serious public health problem in the Philippines. The rate of tooth decay on permanent teeth remains high and statistics show that more than seven out of 10 Filipinos have never been to a dentist.

Poor oral hygiene and lack of proper dental care lead to tooth decay and gum disease which can cause other infections.

In August 2017, our Tondo sponsor site in the Philippines in collaboration with the Filipino Chinese Dental Association, launched the program:

A sponsored child receives a dental check-up in Tondo.

'Zero Cavities for Chalice Sponsored Children in Tondo.' Two years into the implementation of the dental program, we have seen a tremendous improvement in the oral health of our sponsored children. Follow-up checks have shown a remarkable improvement. To date, more than 70% of sponsored children now have healthy teeth and gums. The program was able to extend its services to the siblings of sponsored children. Of the 156 siblings, 103 had received complete oral rehabilitation. The site was also able to offer dental services to some parents who were looking for employment but were hampered by their dental condition.

We have recently launched Zero Cavities Phase II to continue this great work and achieve zero cavities for all remaining sponsored children and their siblings (about 3200 beneficiaries in total, including 1700 sponsored children). Break the Barriers: Danna's Hearing Loss Doesn't **Hold Her Back**

Even though she was born deaf, nine-year-old Danna was only diagnosed with hearing issues when she was three. Doctors urged her mother, Eugenia, to get Danna's hearing tested when she was a baby, but the tests were too expensive. Danna and her mother, Eugenia. By the time Eugenia saved up enough for a test, Danna's brain had almost no connection to her ears, resulting in deep hearing loss.

When Danna got older, she attended public school, but struggled as her teacher didn't specialize in deaf students. When staff from our Cañete site in Peru met Danna, they noticed her intense desire to communicate with others. Danna was accepted into our sponsorship program, and chosen by a Canadian sponsor shortly after!

With the support of sponsorship, Danna was able to visit a hearing and language center in Lima. She underwent several tests, and was fitted with hearing aids which allow her to notice some loud noises such as car horns to prevent accidents.



Eugenia searched tirelessly for an affordable school to teach Danna sign language. Eventually, she found one in their home city of Cuzco, and secured a spot for Danna!

Today, Danna is learning sign language and studying hard. "With great satisfaction, we have seen Danna's progress," smiles Sr. Blanca, the site director. "She already writes sentences, pronounces some words, and communicates well with her mother, teacher, and classmates. She's responsible, does her homework, and is very sociable!" With the help of the school, Danna will be able to get a professional job when she's older. Eugenia is incredibly thankful for Chalice and her daughter's sponsor.

The Sweet Taste of Success

You could say that since March of 2019, Nelson Mandela Secondary School in Morogoro, Tanzania, has been a hive of activity.

The school property, blessed with a large protected forested area, is the perfect place to set up beehives. With the gift of 30 hives through the Chalice school farming program, students of the 4K agricultural club became stewards of a new honey-making endeavor. Steven O., the agriculture teacher, hoped for enough honey to sustain the project.

In November, the children were ready to bottle their first batch! They carefully poured their honey into the bottles and proudly affixed their label. As an added selling point, it is a belief in Tanzanian culture that honey from

the forest, as opposed to field flowers, has additional medicinal properties.

Agriculture has always been a part of their curriculum, but until the Chalice school farming program was implemented, it wasn't possible to teach it with hands-on experience.

"I am so grateful for this program which has enabled us to teach agriculture through practical lessons, as opposed to earlier days when we just had to teach theory alone," says Steven

With Chalice's assistance, which has included water and irrigation systems and starter crops (including 100 banana seedlings), the farming club and agricultural classes have been producing robust harvests and plans to expand to 200 hives.

They can sell their honey for \$3.50 CAN per litre, and when they have increased their number of hives, they expect to produce 15L per harvest. Half of their proceeds go towards their school feeding program, which supplies all 600 students with a daily meal, 20% will go into the 4K club, and the remainder for the school and reinvestment in the honey project.

"Our school benefits a lot," says Steven, "because students get the vegetables from the farm for their own consumption, as well as selling some to sustain the project."

Stepan is 26 years old and comes from large family. When he was three, his father passed away and his mother Svitlana was left alone with four children. In 2003 Stepan was so excited to be chosen by a Chalice sponsor. Over the next 15 years, sponsorship offered tremendous support for his family, motivating him to do well at school.

When he was 14 Stepan went through a critical health issue resulting in a disability to his leg. Stepan is so thankful for the support of his sponsors which helped him go through this very difficult time.

After high school graduation Stepan entered a trade school to become a mechanic. At that time his mother did not have a job and suffered from high blood pressure. Stepan was did very well at his studies and graduated with his Master of Industrial Education degree. Thanks to his high grades Stepan was sent to study at Kharkiv University, graduating with a bachelor's degree. At this time his mother's health condition worsened a great deal. So, he returned home to his village and got a part-time job fixing motorcycles and cars.

Now finished school, Stepan has retired from sponsorship and has moved to Poland in search of a better paying job. Last September he found his dream job as a car mechanic, his hard work was noticed and he

"I have been raised with a passion for sharing with others, and although my dear grandmother has passed, she lives in my heart. She taught me to spread the virtues of kindness and love to others.'

The children at Gitero Primary School eat their meals on the playground, which is their only dining area. In the summers, dust blows over the entire area, coating the children's food; and when it rains, they eat their meals in the mud. This project was much needed and the children are looking forward to their new dining hall.

"Chalice is an agency that I love dearly, through which we can support those who are not as blessed as we are in

Tribal Village Gets Homes



Located on a rocky mountain top in the southwest of Tamil Nadu, India lies the tiny tribal hamlet of Kunkaniparai. Life is hard for the 17 families who earn a low daily wage working on the farm of the neighbouring estate. Living in shacks made of mud and bamboo sticks left them feeling insecure and unprotected. During monsoon season, the heavy winds and rain were a constant worry and no bathroom facilities at home led to frequent illnesses.

In 2016, circle group members from our Madurai Sponsor Site asked Chalice staff to visit this community and see how they could help. After this visit Chalice distributed a pair

of goats from the gift catalogue to 10 families to help them earn additional income.

In a subsequent visit families were advised that if they could obtain the legal documents showing they owned their land then gift catalogue funds could be used to build them safer homes.

This was a hard promise for the villagers to believe. In the past people took their photos and made promises but never delivered. In the end seven families decided to take a chance and got their land documentation, a long and arduous process, with the hope that this time things would be different.

In her thank you letter 30-year-old Abirami writes, "We were living in a small hut made of bamboo sticks, and mud. People visited our area and promised they would build a house, but they were false promises. First Chalice gave us two goats then they built a beautiful house with a bathing room for us We thank the Chalice donors who brought the tremendous changes in our life. We pray and ask God's blessings for your family."


