Aju and Anuja worked hard through high school, encouraged by their parents, the Kerala site staff, and Aju's sponsor.

Aju set his sights on a career in technology. When he graduated in the spring of 2020, he started a course in computers and programming. He excelled, and his teachers noticed. His school set him up for a job interview with an IT company, where he was offered his first full-time job!

"This is a proud moment, and it was possible with the support of the Chalice sponsorship," Aju says.

"I thank my sponsor who made a difference in my life. I pray that God may continue to bless all our sponsors and the Chalice staff for their love and sacrifice."

## Aju turns sacrifice into success

"It fills my heart, and it warms me up," writes Aju, as he thinks back on the role his Chalice sponsor played in his young life.

Growing up near our Kerala sponsor site in India, Aju's young life was marked with sacrifice.

"My parents were financially poor. My father was a daily wage earner, and my mother was a homemaker," he says.

It was difficult for his parents to earn enough income for his education and that of his older sister, Anuja.

One day, when Aju was eight, site workers from our Kerala sponsor site came to visit. After listening to his parents describe their situation, site staff enrolled Aju in the sponsorship program.

Axel's and Katheryne's smiles are just two of the many lighting up the faces of children around the world thanks to a gift from Chalice's gift catalogue. They live in Guatemala, sponsored through our Luis Amigó site. Schools in their area re-opened to students in February 2021 in a "blended" model. Students are navigating a mixture of in-person learning and the online lessons that began during pandemic school closures. For families who lost income sources during the shutdowns, the cost of school fees and school supplies are prohibitive. But thanks to all those who gave a gift through Chalice's gift catalogue, the Luis Amigó site stepped in for children in need.

Axel is a charismatic and studious child who lives with his parents, Ana and Oscar. He is a big brother to two sisters, Anyelín and Dulce Danaé. Oscar is a hardworking fisher. Despite the efforts of both Ana and Oscar to provide for their three children, health challenges have hindered their family finances. In 2020, a Chalice sponsor chose Axel. He is excited because it means he can stay in school. His parents' concerns about affording his supplies were allayed thanks to supporters of the gift catalogue. He is now wellequipped for class. "God bless you and multiply blessings in your lives," writes Axel to all Chalice supporters.

Katheryne is in grade seven, and lives with her mother Nicolasa, her stepfather Angel, and her little sister Karla. She is a "calm, cheerful, respectful, intelligent and responsible young woman."

In 2016, Katheryne entered the sponsorship program, which has been a great support for her parents. Katheryne's way of showing her gratitude for her sponsor is to maintain good grades and stay on the honour roll. But, with COVID-19's impact on her stepfather's business, she needed assistance to buy enough school supplies. Through the Luis Amigó site, the gift catalogue was a great blessing for her.

"I tell you that I felt very happy when I received the news of the supplies that you sent me," writes Katheryne. "May God bless you and thank you for sending me your support, I thank you with all my heart."

"Thank you very much," echo the Luis Amigó site staff. "God bless you and fill you with joy and satisfaction for so much done in favour of so many in need."

Someday soon, architecture student Kimberly is going to be the brains behind great buildings. But this year, she had a health crisis that shook everything she had built for herself. In April, she had frequent bouts of stomach pain, which became so persistent that she was hospitalized in May. Her doctors diagnosed her with necrotizing pancreatitis (extreme complication of acute pancreatitis). After nearly a month, she was discharged from hospital, but still had problems eating and could only manage small portions of liquified vegetables.

Kimberly's mother, Justa, supports her six children as a private residential cleaner. It's a humble income, and she's very grateful three of her children have Chalice sponsors through the Levantate Mujer sponsor site in Sucre, Bolivia. Their sponsors have helped her support their education, nutrition, and other daily needs.

Justa was very worried about Kimberly, and saw she was not recovering well. She returned her to the hospital in June. There, she learned that because the public medical system was coping with the COVID-19 pandemic, Kimberly's treatment would be delayed. Faster treatment would mean private care, which was far beyond Justa's means.

"At the moment I was admitted to the hospital, I was worried because I did not know how we were going to meet the expenses of the treatment," recounts Kimberly in a letter. "I thought that our income is only enough for food."

But with great determination, Justa found a compassionate doctor who would provide treatment free of charge. He diagnosed Kimberly with a cyst on her pancreas and performed surgery to remove it, at no cost to the family.

With Kimberly finally recovering, Justa was still expected to pay for diagnostic tests and the special diet her daughter needed, amounting to more than \$1,500 CAD - a crushing sum. The Levantate Mujer sponsor site requested the funds through Chalice's critical needs program, and Chalice supporters quickly stepped in and donated the full amount.

"When I found out the Chalice donors will help me, I felt so happy and relieved," writes Kimberly. "This meant a new opportunity for me."

With the financial burden relieved, Kimberly focused on her recovery and plans to return to her architecture program when schools re-open.

"Little by little, I am recovering...and I am grateful for your huge support that was not just for me but for my family too," she continues. "You give us a new hope. Thank you."

## Mystery solved: Clean water rapidly improves health in rural Ukraine

"AFTER 16 YEARS OF HAVING A MYSTERIOUS SICKNESS IN CHILDREN, SANITATION SERVICES FOUND THAT THE VILLAGE'S WATER WAS CONTAMINATED."

For more than 16 years, the villagers of Holoby, Ukraine lived with a frightening mystery. Parents and pediatricians were seeing unusually high rates of allergies, as well as intestinal and liver diseases in children. Even with increased access to healthcare and pharmacies, the problems persisted.

The sanitation services then tested the village water. The mystery was solved, but with alarming results. The children had been drinking contaminated water at the school for years, and the cooks were making lunches with the same water.

"The situation was gaining the scale of an ecological disaster," writes Halyna, the Pochaiv site director.

State services closed the Holoby village school and sent all 680 students home without assignments or a way to continue their studies. Parents started to consider moving away in search of better conditions.

The Pochaiv site partnered with Chalice to remedy the situation as quickly as possible. With the support of generous donors, local workers began their five-month project of drilling, removing, installing and building an entirely new water system. Local parents stepped in to help wherever they needed an extra set of hands. The Chalice-supported project also included a replacement water storage tank, and the workers installed new drinking fountains and a purification system.

Through their efforts, 680 students and 2400 non-sponsored community members now have safe, clean water. Parents have seen the nausea, vomiting, and stomach pain disappear. Children no longer suffer from allergies or toothaches. Visits to their pediatricians have dwindled.

"Residents of the community saw their lives improve rapidly," writes Halyna. "The community has not seen such a significant impact for a long time! It was possible due to Chalice's presence in this rural community."

The community of Holoby and the Pochaiv site extend their deep gratitude to all the supporters of this project, who have transformed the whole village and improved the lives of hundreds of children for years to come.



## **Njiru Stars Strive For Success**

## "DONATIONS AND GIFTS THAT OFFER POSSIBILITIES TO THE NEXT GENERATION."

When supporters give to Chalice, they know they're making a difference – but not just in the life of one person. Often, these gifts and donations go on to benefit large groups of people and offer renewed possibilities to the next generation. The Njiru Stars are a shining example of how a simple act of kindness intertwined with support from donors can empower a whole community.

Near our Nairobi site in Kenya is a spot known as the 'jobless corner,' where the unemployed wait for someone to approach them with daily wage work. Unemployment is high among young people in the area, and stable jobs are difficult to find.

Martha, Chalice's East Africa site coordinator, is a bright and outgoing woman. Every day, she walked by the jobless corner, and being a naturally friendly person, began chatting with the people there.

She heard their stories, and her heart broke for the suffering this lack of stable employment caused them and their families. Having trained many Chalice family circles on the family funding savings model, Martha knew she could help. She soon organized those she spoke with into a group. Through support from Chalice donors, she offered entrepreneurship and financial training. Empowered by their new knowledge, the Njiru Stars were born, and the group quickly changed the course of its members' lives.

Thanks to a Chalice gift catalogue donation, the men received a shipping container they used to house several businesses and stores. A convenience store, a café, a barbershop, and a vegetable shop all got their start, thanks to this donation. This especially came in handy when the COVID-19 pandemic hit, providing much-needed employment.

But there was only one problem.

"A day like this last year we had one container," recalls Bernard, treasurer of Njiru Stars, "and it was not enough for all of us."

More people needed space to run a business, while others just needed upgraded tools.

Thanks to grants funded by generous Chalice donors, the Stars got what they needed, including an additional container.

There is now a food business serving up crispy fries, and a carpenter who has all the right tools for his work. One business is raising chicks for eventual re-sale, while a sandal-making business called African Attire has found its footing. There's even a milk ATM!

Bernard now has the right tools to offer welding services, and his business is growing.

On top of all that, the ripple effects created by the Njiru Stars keep on coming. Now, the members can take better care of their children, starting with their education. School fees in Kenya are high, but with their new employment, the parents can afford to pay them. Bernard says he wasn't sure if his son would be able to attend high school. But thanks to Njiru Stars, he can afford the fees along with books and supplies.

"This group has supported me so much," he said.

Education will ensure his son never has to end up on the jobless corner.

The group is getting financially savvy, too. Thanks to training through Chalice, all Njiru stars regularly use bank accounts and have money set aside for emergencies.

"Before Chalice came into our lives," says Simon, chairman at Njiru stars, "we were seen as people who didn't have hope in their lives. The society hated us. When anything was stolen, they were pointing their fingers at us.

But when Chalice started supporting us...we have become role models."

The Stars are now mentoring five groups of young people, teaching entrepreneurship and how to save. They hope the mentorship program will eventually spread across Nairobi County - making a difference for years to come.

# Family funding lays the foundations for stronger families

SIRILIA WAS THRILLED WHEN TWO OF HER CHILDREN WERE SELECTED BY CHALICE SPONSORS. IT LIFTED THE BURDEN OF HER CHILDREN'S EDUCATIONAL COSTS AND NUTRITIONAL NEEDS, GIVING SIRILIA THE FREEDOM TO ASPIRE TO AN EVEN GREATER VISION FOR HER FAMILY.

Sirilia's prudence and determination are a shining representation of the parents and guardians Chalice works with through our family funding sponsorship model. Sirilia raised her three children on her own in a community near our Haiti North sponsor site. Like her neighbours, she relied on her small farm for both income and everyday meals, but erratic rains and long droughts devastated harvests, increasing uncertainty and food insecurity.

Sirilia was thrilled when two of her children were selected by Chalice sponsors. It lifted the burden of her children's educational costs and nutritional needs, giving Sirilia the freedom to aspire to an even greater vision for her family. She became focused on her dream: her own house.

Even before Chalice started the family funding model of sponsorship in the Haiti North site, Sirilia had been saving, little by little, until she finally had enough to buy her own plot of land.

When Chalice helped her open her first bank account, new doors opened.

"I have had a chance to have my own savings [bank] book for the very first time in my life," Sirilia writes. She made a careful plan for her new account.

"I started saving a small amount each quarter," she recounts, "and started buying construction materials like sand, rock, and cement in order to build a small house for the family."

The plan is for a three-bedroom house – and she's already built two rooms!

"It's not over yet, there is some work left to be done," she says, but they are far enough along that the family can move in!

"[It's our] own house and we are so proud to live in our own house." Sirilia beams.

"Thank you very much, because without Chalice the family would not be able to accomplish this great thing," she says.

## Fresh food leads to fresh faces in Ghana

"THANKS TO THE NUTRITION PROGRAM IN SCHOOLS, STUDENTS CAN HAVE ACCESS TO BALANCED AND NUTRITIOUS MEALS HELPING THEM TO IMPROVE THEIR HEALTH AND ENERGY."

Chalice has the privilege of working with the students and staff of the Wa School for the Deaf and the nearby Don Bosco school in Ghana, both of which provide specialized education programs for children with disabilities. The students are high achievers, performing well on their exams. Senior high school students have the option to pursue trades, in turn planning to start their own businesses.

The schools provide the students with a daily hot meal with food supplies provided by governmental organizations. But the cooks continually found their pantries running short – the deliveries simply were not enough.

The cooks persevered, making the most of what they had and trying to maximize nutritional value, but struggled to serve consistently balanced meals. Fresh fruits and vegetables, a key source of vitamins

2,848,733 meals served and nutrients, were especially scarce. The students, typically so animated, started slumping as their energy, attendance, and grades declined.

Thanks to supporters of Chalice's nutrition fund, the SFD sponsor site stepped in to fill the gaps in the pantry shelves and refrigerator. Now the cooks can prepare nutrient-rich and balanced meals with the supplemental ingredients they choose, which have included beans, beef, fruit and milk.

The children are "always active and willing to go," writes the staff, because they receive three hearty meals per day. Between the two schools, 380 students are benefiting from the nutrition program, including 187 sponsored children. The teachers comment on how 'fresh' the children look, and parents confirm they see improvements in their children's health and strength. Thanks to this program, there was even a boost in enrollment after COVID-19 restrictions lifted in 2021.

# Relief for COVID-struck India "wipes away sorrows"

"WE BOUGHT THE REQUIRED FOOD STOCK FOR THE FAMILY," SHE WRITES. "IT HAS WIPED OUR SORROWS AWAY AND CHALICE HAS MADE US SMILE. WE ARE HAPPY AND GRATEFUL TO CHALICE AND THE DONORS."

Sahaya is the proud mom of two "grown up girls." They live together with Sahaya's parents in a community near our Madurai sponsor site. Sahaya lost her husband a few years ago, and the family depends on finding agricultural work on farms owned by other people. Her parents can no longer do the strenuous farm labour but are great helpers to Sahaya around the house. The family has been grateful for daughter Vanitha Mary's Chalice sponsor.

"I need to take care of the educational and medical needs of [my] daughters," Sahaya writes. When the COVID-19 lockdowns began in India, her work opportunities dried up, and the family had no income. The girls stayed home and continued their classes online, made possible by Vanitha Mary's sponsor, whose funds paid the school fees. But there was little left over for other urgent needs, especially groceries.

The Madurai site staff let the family know that an extra amount would be coming to their bank accounts, thanks to all those who supported Chalice's India COVID-19 disaster relief fund. Sahaya immediately purchased a bulk supply of essential foods.



## **Chalice Jubilation Day**




